Why we exist?

Non-profit organisations (NPOs) make a significant contribution to the education sector in South Africa. Their diversity, reach and innovative solutions make them strong partners to both government and business in South Africa.

However, in many cases NPOs are just not heard, invited or consulted in important decision-making processes that affect them.

In answer to a call for greater organisation amongst NPOs following the Education NGO Leadership Summit in March 2016, NASCEE was formed by NPOs for NPOs to amplify the voice of NPOs in education in 2018.

Background

Since the 1990s non-governmental (NGOs), non-profit organisations (NPOs), activists and other social change entities have watched their roles change. These organisations have had to adjust to a changing political environment, test and learn from educational advancements, engage in new forms of advocacy and leverage new technologies (to name just a few).

Education plays a pivotal role in shaping the future of South Africa and South Africans. Specifically, the National Development Plan 2030 sets a clear vision and specific goals for the development education in South Africa. The enormity and complexity of achieving these goals requires

the cooperation and collaboration from all spheres of society – in response, the National Education Collaboration Trust hosted the Education NGO Leadership Summit, in March 2016.

This summit was seminal event that lead to the establishment of the National Association for Social Change Entities in Education (NASCEE) in 2018.

The summit fanned the possibility for non-profits in education to work much more closely together. The possibility of creating channels that would enable conversations and partnerships, which had relied on serendipity and chance meetings, excited the summit delegates.

NASCEE sees a future in which education NPOs effectively work for positive impact through education.

Our Flagship Projects

The Annual NASCEE Conference

Organising and hosting an annual conference for our members and other stakeholders in education. The 2020 NASCEE conference Collaboration for Change – opportunities for implementation will be the second annual conference, and will be held in August 2020.

Last year's conference NPOs Working in Education: from promise to practice left conference delegates with a new found energy and sense of purpose in what they were doing, but more importantly it lead to the formal adoption of the NASCEE constitution and the election of its first board at its founding meeting.

The Edvision Partnership

The partnership with Rand Merchant Bank around the beta testing and development of the Edvision platform will result in more effective matchmaking between funders (including corporate social investment funds) and implementers (mainly NPOs) to launch important projects improving the state of education in South Africa.

Other Projects

In addition, NASCEE provides regional capacity building workshops – the current series focuses on Governance and Reporting. A previous workshop introduced our members to Impact Investing. We anticipate these workshops becoming targeted problem solving sessions guided by relevant experts in response to our members needs.
